**June Prisoner of Conscience:** Tunisia ex-justice minister **Noureddine Bhiri** faces trial on charges of 'trying to change the form of the government', under Article 72 of the penal code, punishable by the death penalty. He is accused based on a social media post he has denied writing, which was also confirmed by an expert appointed by the accusation chamber. Since his arrest on 13/2/23, he has been held in pre-trial detention in the Mornagula prison. The Tunisian authorities must immediately release him and drop all politically motivated charges against him.
