June Prisoner of Conscience: Tunisia ex-justice minister **Noureddine Bhiri** faces trial on charges of 'trying to change the form of the government', under Article 72 of the penal code, punishable by the death penalty. He is accused based on a social media post he has denied writing, which was also confirmed by an expert appointed by the accusation chamber. Since his arrest on 13/2/23, he has been held in pre-trial detention in the Mornagula prison. The Tunisian authorities must immediately release him and drop all politically motivated charges against him.

A General Election Hustings with candidates for the Salisbury constituency has been organised by the city centre churches on Sunday 23 June, 6–7.30pm in St Thomas’ church (SP1 1BA). Free entry. All welcome. The hustings will be hosted by Elinor Goodman, former political editor of Channel 4 News, regular presenter on The Week in Westminster, and member of the Leveson Inquiry. Those who attended the churches’ shared Lent Lectures in the Cathedral in February and March are invited to consider the issues we were exploring together as you reflect on questions you may like to put to the candidates.

Congregational giving update. Following the success of last autumn’s giving campaign, we are looking to align future campaigns with the cathedral’s financial year (April-March). This will mean that information about giving can be set alongside what has been achieved as well as plans for the year ahead. Between last autumn’s campaign and next spring, here is an interim update:

- The Cathedral is deeply grateful for all worshippers who support the cathedral financially. The best means of regular faithful giving is through the Church of England’s Parish Giving Scheme (PGS): every penny given comes to the Cathedral and PGS arranges Gift Aid more quickly and efficiently than any other method. Please Google ‘PGS Salisbury Cathedral’. We encourage those who are new to the Cathedral to join our scheme and those who give by Standing Order to come over to PGS.
- Per capita congregational giving is lower than in most parish churches and the Cathedral will be spending significant sums in 2024–25 on items of direct benefit to worshippers, including relamping the interior in LED, in addition to the ongoing costs of ministry.
