July Prisoner of Conscience: Ahmad Fahim Azimi and Seddiqullah Afghan, activists with the education organization Fekre Behtar, were arbitrarily arrested at their office in Kabul, by the Taliban's General Directorate of Intelligence District 40, in October 2023. Seddiqullah was released in April under the Eid pardon decision for prisoners. Ahmad is imprisoned in Pul-e-Charkhi prison. He is falsely accused of working against the Taliban de-facto authorities, convicted through an unfair trial by the Taliban primary court and sentenced to one year in prison.
