July Prisoner of Conscience: Ahmad Fahim Azimi & Seddiqullah Afghan, activists with the education organization Fekre Behtar, were arbitrarily arrested at their office in Kabul, by the Taliban's General Directorate of Intelligence District 40, in October 2023. Sediqullah was released in April under the Eid pardon decision for prisoners. Ahmah is imprisoned in Pule-Charkhi prison. He is falsely accused of working against the Taliban de-facto authorities, convicted through an unfair trial by the Taliban primary court and sentenced to a year in prison.

Cathedral Lighting. Work has started onsite to renew the lighting inside the cathedral (relamping). Electricians will be working around the building during August, September and October – and will return in the New Year if necessary. This work is necessary because the previous lamps are coming to the end of their working life and are no longer available. The new LEDs (in part funded by a generous grant from the Friends) will cut the power required for our lighting by over 70%, reducing our demand on the National Grid by about 25 tonnes of carbon dioxide a year. *Kenneth Padley, Treasurer*
