**August Prisoner of Conscience:** Pedro Albert Sánchez, a 68-year-old teacher and human rights defender, has been arbitrarily detained in Cuba since 22 November 2023. Despite his critical health conditions, including cancer, Pedro is being denied adequate healthcare. He is a prisoner of conscience jailed simply for exercising his human rights to freedom of expression and of peaceful assembly. We urge the Cuban authorities to immediately and unconditionally release Pedro Albert Sánchez and ensure he urgently receives adequate healthcare.

**Leaden Hall: an update** As the planning process for the Cathedral's vision for restoring Leaden Hall in the Close continues, a brochure has been produced to provide background information, share the latest plans and provide an update on progress. **Cathedral Lighting.** Work has started onsite to renew the lighting inside the cathedral (relamping). Electricians will be working around the building Aug–Oct – and will return in the New Year if necessary. This work is necessary because the previous lamps are coming to the end of their working life and are no longer available. The new LEDs (in part funded by a generous grant from the Friends) will cut the power required for our lighting by over 70%, reducing our demand on the National Grid by about 25 tonnes of carbon dioxide a year. *Kenneth Padley, Treasurer*
