



Please leave plenty of time to arrive at your ticket time. Visit the outside experience first (10min show), then you can explore inside at your leisure.


There is no parking on site. The nearest car parks are Crane Street and New Street.




## Map



Well behaved dogs are allowed but, please only bring your dog if they are comfortable with loud noises, crowds and flashing lights.






# Humans through Time\_\_\_\_\_


#### Relativity

Tickets scanned here. Please have yours ready to present



## 3 Cloisters


As you continue walking through the Cloisters, you are immersed in text from the 1895 science fiction novel, The Time Machine by HG Wells, about a Victorian scientist known as the Time Traveller who travels approximately 800,806 years into the future. Wells' novel is known for popularising the concept of time travel by using a vehicle or device to travel.



#### **Timelapse**




As you enter the South Transept you will see a sound and light installation that allows you to experience time in reverse as objects reflecting time are seen travelling backwards.



### Ageing




As you enter the Trinity Chapel you will see a poignant installation piece which takes you through time - from birth to the end of life.



#### Wormholes




You are immersed in light as you wander down the North Quire Aisle entering wormholes between parallel times.
