November Prisoner of Conscience: Yehia Hussein Abdelhady

On 31 July, policeman arrested prominent Egyptian opposite politician Yehia Hussein Abdelhady. His arrest came after he published a post on Facebook criticising the President and army calling for a regime change. On the same day as his arrest, he was interrogated and was ordered to pretrial detention for 15 days pending investigation into bogus terrorism-related charges and publishing "false news". He must be released as he is detained solely for his peaceful exercise of the right to freedom of expression.
