

For many people, a Tower Tour is the absolute highlight of their visit to Salisbury Cathedral. In the winter months we extend this unique experience into the twilight hours, offering you the opportunity to see unparalleled views of the city's twinkling Christmas lights.

On the way up to the tower you will enjoy other spectacular sights – an uninterrupted aerial view of the inside of the Cathedral, the interior of the roofspace above the main nave, and the inside of the spire itself supported by medieval wooden scaffolding. Our knowledgeable guides will tell you all about the construction of this architectural masterpiece.

THE EPIPHANY DEVOTION

Join us for the last of the popular processional services celebrating Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany.

Telling the story of the journey of the Magi, travelling to worship the infant Jesus, this moving service is made up of readings, devotional addresses, and the Cathedral Choir, joined by period instruments. They will be performing parts V and VI of Bach's *Christmas Oratorio*.


LATEST RELEASE
