November Prisoner of Conscience: Yehia Hussein Abdelhady. On 31 July, policeman arrested prominent Egyptian opposite politician Yehia Hussein Abdelhady. His arrest came after he published a post on Facebook criticising the President and army calling for a regime change. On the same day as his arrest, he was interrogated and was ordered to pretrial detention for 15 days pending investigation into bogus terrorism-related charges and publishing "false news". He must be released as he is detained solely for his peaceful exercise of the right to freedom of expression.

Cathedral Notices

From the Bishop of Salisbury: 'I, together with Bishop Karen and Bishop Andrew, respect the decision of Archbishop Justin to step aside from his role as Archbishop of Canterbury and will continue to pray for him and his family. Archbishop Justin has taken personal and institutional responsibility to enable deeper change. The Makin review has exposed horrific abuse and misuse of power over many years. Questions out of this report must be addressed by the church in a trauma-informed way, which places victims and survivors at the centre of it. In recent days the focus of debate has moved away from this, so I would ask us to refocus our attention back to the experience of victims and survivors and the lessons we must learn from doing so. In this diocese we will continue to work to implement good safeguarding practices, supported by clergy and volunteers in our parishes and advised by our professional safeguarding team. We remain committed to engaging with victims and survivors of abuse'.

At the Cathedral we will be marking 'Safegaurding Sunday' on Sunday 24 November.

Sunday 24th November - Cantata Evensong - The Cathedral Choir will be joined by period instrumentalists for J.S Bach's Cantata Wachet auf, ruft uns die Stimme, (BWV 140). The words and music look in anticipation towards Advent and Christmas. This service will be in the Nave.

We will be holding a **Name Amnesty** during refreshments after the 10.30am service on Sunday November 24th. Those staying for coffee will be invited to write themselves a name badge (pens and labels provided). It's a simple way to get to know one another better - including those we've met before but it's too embarrassing to ask their name again!

The Lydians will not be meeting in December, our first meeting in the 2025 will be in January.

The late David Brown. David will have been known to many in the congregation, having been a frequent worshipper here over many decades. He has recently died, and there will be a memorial service in the New Year. Details to follow in due course.

Sunday Offertory Procession. Each week during the Offertory Hymn the elements, The Bread & Wine, are carried to altar by people from the congregation. To ever increase our outreach and inclusion we have since the summer been deliberately approaching people in the congregation on the Sunday asking if they would like to Take the Bread & Wine up during the offertory hymn. We believe this is being well received and has widened our welcome. It is not a case of excluding people but rather increase the circle of people who offer their part.

The Revd Jules Barnes, Anglican Chaplain in Hamburg, has been appointed Vicar of the Close. She will be licensed by the Bishop at Evensong on Sunday 16 February 2025. Jules was ordained in 2010 (deacon) and 2011 (priest) and served her curacy in Wilton. She worked as Chaplain to the Bishop of Bristol and was incumbent of a parish in the Diocese of Chichester before moving to Europe in 2021. We are delighted that she will be joining us and look forward to her ministry here.
