January Prisoner of Conscience: On 3 December 2024, Moussa Tchangari, a human rights defender and secretary general of Citizens' Alternative Spaces, was arrested in Niamey, Niger's capital. He was at home when at least three gunmen in plain clothes, who claimed to be policemen, arrested him. Moussa Tchangari's whereabouts remained unknown until 5 Dec, when he was located at the Central Service for Combatting Terrorism and Organized Transnational Crime, in Niamey. He has been charged, amongst other things, with advocating terrorism and criminal association in connection with terrorism. Niger's authorities must drop all charges and immediately release Moussa Tchangari, who is being detained solely for the peaceful exercise of his human rights.

Olivier Messiaen – La Nativité du Seigneur. A liturgical performance of Olivier Messiaen's 1935 organ cycle, La Nativité du Seigneur, will be given by John Challenger on Saturday 11 January at 1730. The full nine movements of this vivid, colourful and ground-breaking work will be played on the Father Willis organ, between readings from Scripture. These 'Organ Vespers', which will last just over an hour, are an opportunity to find space for prayer and contemplation through Messiaen's deeply devotional music.

Candlelight Concert, Friday 17 January 8pm. Internationally renowned tenor Ruairi Bowen and pianist William Vann perform Britten's Winter Words and other English song in the intimate setting of the North Transept by candlelight. The cycle explores themes of memory, transience, and the passage of time, often through vivid imagery of the natural world and human experience. The concert will also include works such as Finzi's setting of metaphysical poet Thomas Traherne's poetry, "Dies Natalis" in a setting for piano and tenor.
